Leonia Action Alliance is a grassroots community group working toward progress and inclusivity in Leonia and beyond. LAA coordinates and collaborates on local efforts to protect, advance and educate about our environment, social justice, healthcare, gun violence, civic action and engagement, and human rights. LAA has organized Women's Marches, a Climate March, helped craft and advocate for a Welcoming Community Resolution in Leonia and sponsored Election Candidate Forums.

Environmental efforts for a Greener Leonia include providing information on recycling, composting, and co-sponsoring a campaign to reduce and eventually eliminate the use of Styrofoam in schools and local businesses. The LAA co-sponsored Leonia's plastic bag recycling effort which has already earned Leonia 2 Trex benches. With LAA members' and the Green Team's efforts, the school district received a large grant to revamp the entire student recycling and waste management system. LAA also partners on many events with Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, the biggest event being Wear Orange Weekend celebrating National Gun Violence Awareness Day the first Friday in June. Leonia Sports Boosters is a 501 (c)(3) whose mission is to foster and support competitive sports interest among young school age Leonians. It raises money for college scholarships, LHS boys and girls sports programs, and improvements to school and borough recreational facilities. Annual fundraising events include the Summer Carnival, June Dinner Dance, and Christmas Tree Sale.

This year Leonia Sports Boosters donated \$73,000 to raise the infield height of the softball/baseball fields at LMS to correct a flooding issue. Renovation included new fencing for fan and player safety, 2 retaining walls, 4 concrete pads under the dugouts and 2 portable dugouts to be used for baseball, softball and soccer. Batting cages were built for the on deck batter and new bleachers were donated for fans to use while attending a game.

LEONIA SCHOOL SERVICES

SPECIAL SERVICES

A full-time Supervisor of Special Services oversees the district's Special Education programs. Education and related services are provided by 38 professional staff members: teachers, school psychologists, school social workers, learning consultants, speech language pathologists, occupational and physical therapists. The Child Study Team evaluates students based on presenting needs. An Individual Education Program (I.E.P.) is developed, implemented and monitored for students found eligible for services. Special instruction is provided for students with learning, emotional, developmental and/or physical disabilities. Resource Centers in each school provide replacement instruction and/ or assistance with academic subjects and the development of organization and study skills. Self-contained classrooms at all three schools provide individualized instruction for students with learning and multiple disabilities.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

The ACS enrichment program provides opportunity, individual and small group coaching, and direct instruction in problem based learning in order for each learner to reach his/her fullest potential. Students work collaboratively to create and apply solutions to real world phenomena and situations, such as redesigning Archimedes puzzle, creating a new business, and creating meal and fitness plans.

At the Middle School, students gifted in Art, Music, Science, Math, Social Studies and Language Arts can apply for Portfolio Programs, which are under the guidance of teacher specialists. At the High School, qualified students can take Advanced Placement and Honors courses in a number of subjects and qualify for college credits. High school students can also participate in the Middle College Program in conjunction with Fairleigh Dickinson University.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Leonia is a diverse community with over 40 languages spoken in our homes. The ELL program serves students who are limited in their ability to speak English. ELL courses are available at each grade level and help students to develop and improve oral communication and reading and writing skills in English.

HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIES

LHS hosts five academies, the Leonia Academy of Science (LAS) with five concentrations; the Leonia Academy for

Hospitality and Culinary Arts (LAHCA); the Marketing and Business Leadership Academy (MBLA) with three specific majors: Accounting, Economics/Finance, and Marketing; the Leonia Humanities Academy (LHA) with two schools: School for Literature and Language and School of Social Sciences; and our newest, The Leonia Music and Arts Conservatories (LMAC). Information on these can be found on the high school's web page.

STUDENT SERVICES

A guidance staff that includes one counselor in the Elementary School, two at the Middle School and four at the High School supports the academic program. At ACS, the guidance counselor provides advice, support, and help in educational and personal development for the students at ACS. This is accomplished by meeting students in both the group setting and individual meetings where topics such as peer pressure, tolerance and study skills are discussed.

The guidance counselor is also available as a resource to parents who may have questions or concerns about their child. At the middle school, counselors provide counseling services, both individual and group, monitor student achievement, maintain open lines of communication between parents and staff and oversee standardized testing. At the high school, the guidance counselors provide career and college counseling, as well as support services for youths at risk.

I&RS COMMITTEE

The Intervention & Referral Services Committee, made up of school administrators, teachers, counselors, child study team members, and parents, suggests strategies and actions for faculty and parents to employ within the General Education program to support the educational needs of students.

FOOD SERVICE

All three schools have a cafeteria and provide low cost, nutritionally balanced hot and cold breakfast and lunch service daily. Free or reduced price breakfast and lunch are available to students who qualify under state and federal programs. Applications are sent to parents at the beginning of each year.

HEALTH SERVICES

School nurses in each school conduct screenings for vision, hearing and scoliosis (curvature of the spine);

maintain health records; record height and weight and blood pressure; administer medications (if a note from the doctor has been provided); and provide emergency care. The school nurse may also make referrals regarding possible emotional or physical difficulties. If a child becomes ill during school, he/she will be sent to the nurse's office. If, in the opinion of the school nurse, the child is unable to remain in school, a parent will be contacted and asked to pick up his/her child to take him/her home. A complete physical is required for children in kindergarten, fourth, seventh and tenth grades.

AFTER SCHOOL CHILD CARE

Leonia School Age Child Care (SACC), an organization run by an independent board, provides child care services for students in grades K-8 at Anna C. Scott School. Students can be dropped off as early as 7:00am and picked up no later than 6:00pm. SACC can be reached at (201) 944-6715.

AFTER SCHOOL ENRICHMENT

The Board of Ed offers after-school enrichment courses at ACS for students in grades 2-5. A variety of courses will be offered for a fee.

COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE PUBLIC

Leonia Schools has a new free APP for smartphones to see menus, agendas, homework assignments and much more!

The high school and middle school utilize Remind to send out information to the students and parents. The ACS Home and School prepares a newsletter regarding ACS activities.

HOME AND SCHOOL ASSOCIATION

Each school has an active Home and School Association. Members raise funds for special programs and trips, for teacher wish-list items, and for scholarships. Volunteers are always needed to help on field trips, to assist in the library, to perform at assemblies, to contribute to bake sales, to help at special events, to translate, to participate in career days, and much more. If you have a special talent you'd like to share, please contact the Home and School chair at your school or attend one of their scheduled meetings listed in this calendar. The Home & School Korean Parents Committee helps with translation of correspondence and helps orientate new families.

CONFERENCES & PROGRESS REPORTS

Conferences are held with parents at least once a year. Progress Reports are sent home with students in grades K-3 three times a year. They are sent home four times a year to students in grades 4 and 5. They must be signed by the parent and returned to the school as quickly as possible.

CURRICULUM

Students receive instruction in language arts, math, science, social studies, world languages, computers, art, music, physical education, library, and science lab.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

All children who are five years old on or before October 1 are registered and developmentally screened for the full-day kindergarten program. Registration takes place in the spring at ACS (see calendar for dates) and orientation programs are provided.

LMS REQUIRED COURSES

Each grade is required to take a full year of Science, Math, Social Studies, Language Arts, and Physical Education. Each grade participates in a different cycle experience, which changes with each marking period.

Home Improvement Permits: If you plan to improve the inside or outside of your property, you must have a permit! Examples of when permits are required include new additions, decks, finishing a basement, remodeling, installation of central air conditioning, replacement of a hot water heater, installing or replacing a fence, and switching from gas to oil heating or vice versa. For a complete list of when permits are required, call the Building Department (201) 592-5780 ext. 253.

Property Maintenance: The owner of the home is responsible for general property maintenance. This includes painting of structures, maintaining leaders, gutters and roofs, and overall appearance of property. Grass must be cut when 6" or higher. All shrubs and bushes must be cut back and trimmed away from all walkways and driveways/roadways so as not to inhibit pedestrian's and vehicle's view. Garbage cans should not be visible from the street. The Property Maintenance Inspector will impose fines if property and businesses are not properly maintained. Contact Steve Oxnard (201) 280-6907.

Illegal Conversion of Dwellings: Conversion of apartments and single-family dwellings into two and three-family units is illegal and will not be tolerated in Leonia. If you believe an illegal dwelling unit exists. contact the Building Dept. and your complaint will be investigated. (201) 592-5780 ext. 255.

SANITATION SERVICES

The DPW picks up garbage, trash, recyclables, yard waste and white goods. All collectables must be at the curb by 7:00am but not before 5:00pm on the preceding day. Residents should not drop off any refuse, or anything else, at the DPW, as it is closed for public access.

Garbage (household refuse) is collected in the rear or side yard on Tuesdays and Fridays. It must be in sealed plastic bags, not loose in a can.

Trash (bulky items such as furniture, rugs, mattresses and box springs) is picked up curbside on alternate Mondays (north of Fort Lee Road) and Thursdays (south of Fort Lee Road). Tires, large appliances, and yard waste are not considered trash.

Recyclable materials (paper, glass, bottles, cans) are picked up every Wednesday at the curb. Mixed paper alternates with comingled (cans, bottles, hard plastics) recyclables. All mixed recyclables should be rinsed. Do not bring directly to DPW. Materials should be in rigid containers, not plastic bags.

Yard Waste (branches, leaves, brush, grass clippings) is picked up at the curb on alternate Mondays. Loose clippings should be in rigid containers or biodegradable bags that do not exceed 50 pounds. Branches, limbs and shrubbery should be bundled. No plastic bags! Landscapers are responsible for removing the yard waste they create.

Loose Leaves can be raked into piles at the curb from October through December only and must be 20 ft. from catch basins. Branches, brush and grass clippings should not be mixed with the leaves. Absolutely no plastic bags with leaves will be picked up!

White qoods (large metal appliances such as refrigerators, washing machines and air conditioners) can be scheduled for pickup by calling (201) 592-5790. Do not place items out before calling DPW.

Hazardous Waste is not collected by the Leonia DPW. You can dispose of your hazardous waste in Mahwah in May, Sept. & Nov); at Bergen Community College in Apr. Jun. & Oct; and in Moonachie in Mar & Jul from 9:00am-3:00pm. For dates call 201-807-5825 or visit www.njhazwaste.com or www.bcua.org

BOROUGH ORDINANCES

A number of Borough ordinances are enforced to ensure a pleasant quality of life for all. A complete list of ordinances can be found on the Borough website www.leoniani.gov

Street Parking: Only Borough residents with permits are permitted to park on streets from 9:00am to 11:00am. Resident permits can be obtained at Borough Hall on the 1st floor.

Business District Parking: Limited to two hours. No parking along Broad Avenue from 11:00pm to 6:00am to facilitate street cleaning. No U-turns.

Elm Place/Beechwood Parking Lot: Permits available at Borough Hall - \$200 per year, Commercial Vehicles - \$1,200.

Speed Limit: The speed limit is 25 mph on all Borough streets, unless otherwise posted.

Noise: Commercial landscaping equipment—Mon-Fri 8:00am to 6:00pm. Sat 9:00am to 6:00pm. Sun prohibited.

Safety: Children 14 and under must wear helmets when riding bicycles, skateboards or scooters.

Off-Leash Dogs: Dudley C. Allen Park(Lakeview) -shall be available for off-leash pet hours at all times the park is open to the public, which is from dawn to dusk."

Snow Removal: Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24-48 hours after cessation of the storm. Please park cars in driveways during snowstorms to facilitate snow removal on the streets.

Borough Trees: The Shade Tree Commission plants trees on the Borough right of way in front of homes. If you would like a tree planted in front of your home, or need your Borough tree trimmed or pruned, go to www.leonianj.gov —"s*ubmit a tree issue.*" You may not cut down or alter a borough tree.

ENTITLEMENT TO ATTEND THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ON A TUITION-FREE BASIS

State law (N.J.S.A. 18A: 38-1) stipulates that the children of legal residents of Leonia are entitled to attend the Leonia Public Schools on a tuition free basis. (Leonia's sending/ receiving relationship with Edgewater entitles Edgewater students to attend the Leonia Public Schools in grades 7-12.)

As stated in Board Policies (Nos. 5111 & 5118), "The mere owning of any property whatsoever does not qualify a parent/ guardian to send children to school in this school district." Additionally, "The Board reserves the right to verify the residency of any pupil and the validity of any affidavit of guardianship." Upon registering a student, parents/guardians must present appropriate documentation demonstrating residency. Affidavit submissions must also comply with applicable state law.

The Leonia Public Schools accepts tuition students on a limited basis and under certain conditions.

Students who are found to be in attendance in the Leonia Public Schools without any entitlement to do so on a tuition-free basis will be removed from school. Their parents/ guardians will be subject to the payment of tuition calculated on a per diem basis for the length of enrollment.

REGISTRATION

Children must register at the school they will be attending. In order to register a child, parents must provide a birth certificate, immunization/medical records, and recent transcripts. In addition, parents must provide proof of residency to the Board of Education Office at 570 Grand Ave.

SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

The Leonia Board of Education holds public meetings twice a month in the Anna C. Scott School Cafeteria, facing Broad Avenue, on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month or as posted.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

If a child will not be attending school, parents must call the school first thing in the morning. Each school has a different procedure so please check your child's Agenda. When the child returns, he/she must bring a note signed by the parent or guardian describing the reason for the absence.

SCHOOL POLICIES

Each student is issued an Agenda at the beginning of the school year detailing all the policies for that school. Please refer to it if you are uncertain about any school issue. All Leonia schools have a strictly defined policy in regard to drugs, alcohol and weapons, as well as for hazing and harassment of any kind. No smoking is allowed on school arounds.

EMERGENCY CLOSINGS

If school is cancelled due to inclement weather you will receive a phone call using the reverse 911 system or log onto www.leoniaschools.org.

PHYSICAL EXAMS

Physical examinations are required by the Board of Education before kindergarten, 4th, 7th, and 10th grades. Students participating in sports need an annual physical along with state-mandated age-appropriate vaccinations.

CROSSING GUARDS

Crossing guards help children safely cross the streets at key intersections. Please encourage your child to cross only where there are guards on duty.
