137 Alan Winters, 125 Knapp Terrace; Mr. Winters spoke about the Planning and Zoning Boards. Things need to be fast tracked not made more difficult by going to one board then 138 139 being sent to another. The process needs to be streamlined. 140 141 Leah Roland, 186 Crescent Avenue; Mrs. Roland stated the March and April meetings of 142 the Board of Adjustment have been cancelled. The vast majority of the meetings are 143 variance requests for non-conforming residence. The process could be streamlined not just for businesses but also for residents. The process is not friendly to welcoming new 144 business into town. The land use process needs to be reviewed. 145 Karen Peters, 142 Park Avenue - Mrs. Peters spoke on the merging of the Boards. Mrs. 146 Peters stated quality of life is the reason for strict zoning laws. Not all the laws are local 147 laws; some are national laws that must also be considered. 148 149 150 Carol Franklin, 433 Highwood Avenue – Ms. Franklin inquired if there is a board charged with recruiting businesses in town. Mayor DeSimone stated the issue here is the rents are 151 152 exceptionally high.
