Borough of Leonia Ordinance 01-10

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF A NEW FIRE ENGINE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF LEONIA, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,736,760 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE VARIOUS GRANTS AND A PRIVATE CONTRIBUTION, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Leonia, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I. The Borough of Leonia, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire a new fire engine, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the various grants, the private contribution and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (I) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the various grants or private contribution hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. The sum of \$100,000 received or to be received as a grant from the Bergen County Community Development Program, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act, is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Linden Terrace authorized in Section 4.A hereof.

Section 7. The sum of \$200,000 received or to be received as a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Glenwood Avenue authorized in Section 4.A hereof.

Section 8. The sum of \$330,000 received or to be received as a grant from the State of New Jersey Customer Onsite Renewable Energy Program is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the solar energy improvements authorized in Section 4.C hereof.

Section 9. The sum of \$195,000 received or to be received as a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Green Acres Program is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Wood Park authorized in Section 4.F hereof.

Section 10. The sum of \$205,000 received or to be received as grants from the County of Bergen Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund (the "County Open Space Fund") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Wood Park authorized in Section 4.F hereof.

Section 11. The sum of \$57,925 received or to be received as a grant from the County Open Space Fund is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Sylvan Park authorized in Section 4.G above.

Section 12. The sum of \$57,925 received or to be received as a private contribution from Leonia Sports Boosters, Inc. ("Sports Boosters") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Sylvan Park authorized in Section 4.G above.

Section 13. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$75,785, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$75,785 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 14. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,515,125 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 15. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,515,125 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 16. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 17. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 22.16 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 18. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$1,515,125 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 19. Any private contributions, any funds received from the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes (other than the Sports Boosters contribution and the various grants hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 20. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 21. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 22. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program

as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 23. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication

thereof after final passage.

"Section 11. The sum of \$113,000 received or to be received as a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Green Acres Program is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Wood Park authorized in Section 4.F. hereof."

Section 6. Section 12 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to increase the amount received or to be received as grants from the County of Bergen Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund for the

improvement of Wood Park authorized in Section 4.F. from \$205,000 to \$239,460 (an increase of \$34,460), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 12. The sum of \$239,460 received or to be received as grants from the County of Bergen Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund (the "County Open Space Fund") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement of Wood Park authorized in Section 4.F. hereof."

Section 7. Section 15 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to decrease the down payment appropriated from \$75,785 to \$71,025 (a decrease of \$4,760), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 15. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$71,025, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$71,025 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes."

Section 8. Section 16 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to decrease the amount of bonds authorized from \$1,515,125 to \$1,419,885 (a decrease of \$95,240), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 16. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,419,885 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted."

Section 9. Section 17 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to decrease the amount of bond anticipation notes authorized from \$1,515,125 to \$1,419,885 (a decrease of \$95,240), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 17. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,419,885 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding."

Section 10. Section 19 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to increase the average period of usefulness of the purposes authorized from 22.16 years to 22.97 years (an increase of 0.81 years), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 19. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 22.97 years computed from the date of said bonds."

Section 11. Section 20 of the Prior Ordinance, as renumbered, is hereby amended to decrease the amount of gross debt of the Borough shown on the

Supplemental Debt Statement filed for the ordinance, as amended, from \$1,515,125 to \$1,419,885 (a decrease of \$95,240), and shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 20. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental

Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the

office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that

the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is

increased by this ordinance by \$1,419,885 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes

authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local

Bond Law."

Section 12. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this amendatory bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for

public inspection.

Section 13. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, Section 40:55D-89 of the New Jersey Municipal Land Use Law requires that a re-examination of a municipality's Master Plan be completed every six years; and

WHEREAS, the planning firm, H2M Associates, Inc. of Parsippany, New Jersey was retained by the governing body of the Borough of Leonia and authorized to conduct the required Master Plan re-examination; and

WHEREAS, H2M was also directed to prepare a Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element to the Master Plan Re-Examination; and

WHEREAS, H2M completed a Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJSA 40:55D-10b the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element were filed with the office of the Borough Clerk for public inspection; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Borough of Leonia considered the Master Plan Re-examination Report, Community Facilities Element Report and Economic Plan Element Report at public hearings held on October 28, 2009, December 16, 2009 and March 24, 2010. pursuant to notice given according to law, at which time members of the public were given the opportunity to raise questions and comment on this matter; and

WHEREAS, members of the public were present at each hearing and did present their views concerning this matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board that it does hereby make the following findings of fact and conclusions based thereon:

- 1. All of the recitals hereinabove set forth are incorporated by reference. All of the exhibits and documents produced in this matter, including but not limited to the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element dated October 18, 2009, and revised through December 10, 2009, prepared by H2M Associates, Inc. which were presented at the public hearing on December 18, 2009, are herein incorporated.
- 2. A public hearing was held on October 28, 2009, for which notice was published in The Record newspaper, and said notice was also served on the Bergen County Planning Board and the Municipal Clerk of each adjacent municipality by certified mail on October 13, 2009.
- 3. Pursuant to NJSA 40:55D-10b the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element were filed with the office of the Borough Clerk on October 13, 2009, for public inspection.
- 4. The public hearing was opened on October 28, 2009, at which time Michael Pessalano, P.P. of H2M Associates, Inc. described the scope and content of the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element and stated that those documents were presented in draft form and would be finalized subject to Board recommendations as well as public comment.
- The Board heard and considered extensive public comment at the public hearing on October 28, 2009.
 - 6. Based on Board recommendations the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities

Element and Economic Plan Element were revised and filed with the office of the Borough Clerk on December 10, 2009, for public inspection

- 7. The public hearing was continued on December 16, 2009, at which time Michael Pessalano of H2M described the revisions which had been incorporated based on the recommendations made at the October hearing.
- 8. At the public hearing on December 16, 2009, this matter was again opened to the public for questions and comments, and members of the public were present and did comment.
- 9. The public hearing was continued on March 24, 2010, for which notice was published in The Record newspaper on March 4, 2010, and said notice was served on the Bergen County Planning Board and the Municipal Clerk of each adjacent municipality by certified mail on March 5, 2010.
- 10. At the public hearing on March 24, 2010, public comment was requested, but no member of the public spoke relative to the final forms of the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element.
- 11. At the public hearing on March 24, 2010, the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element were adopted by unanimous vote of the Board members present.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and Economic Plan Element be and they are hereby adopted by the Planning Board of the Borough of Leonia; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, by copy of this Resolution the Planning Board of the Borough of Leonia hereby advises the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Leonia of the formal adoption by the Board of the Re-Examination Report, Community Facilities Element and
