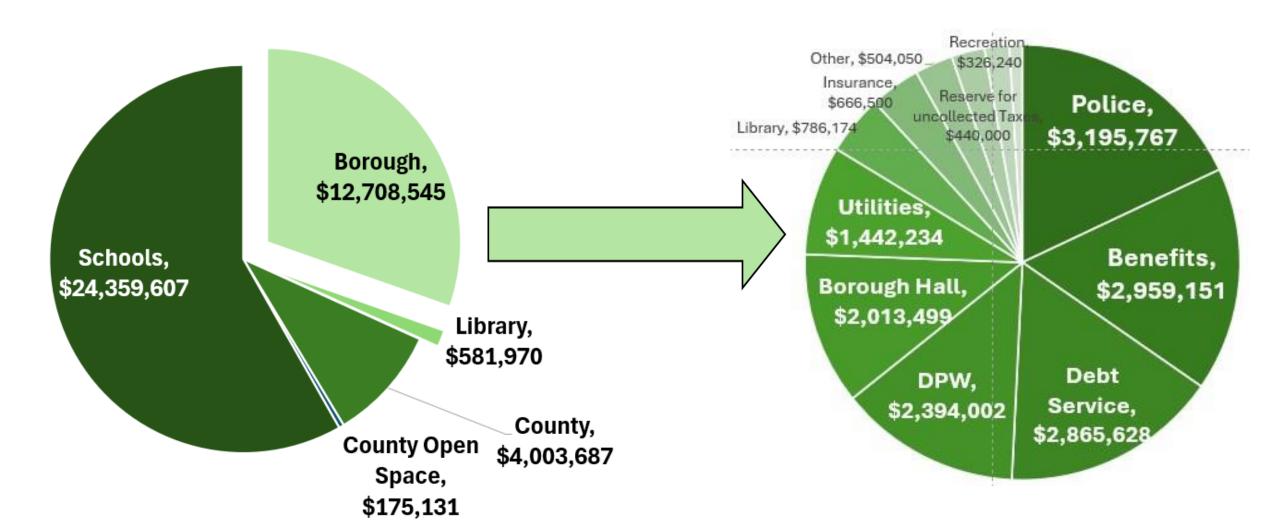

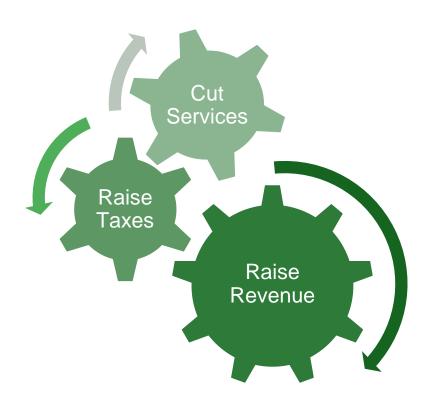

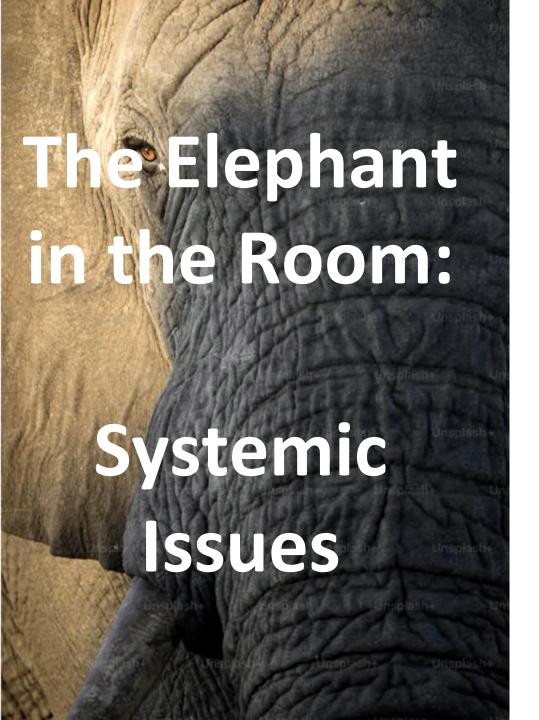

- Push Major Capital Investments to 2025



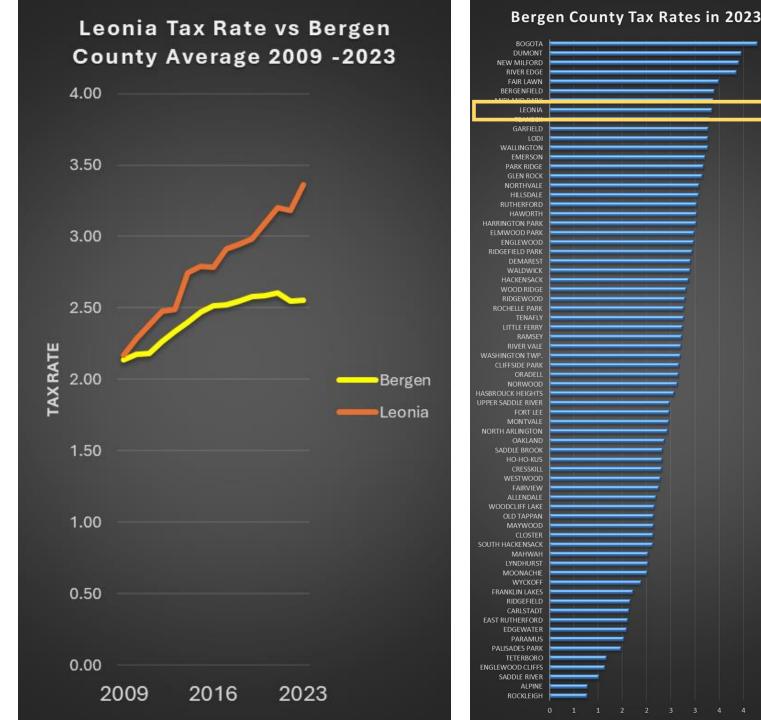
Leonia is an old town with big capital needs over the next 5 to 10 years Home

Healthcare and insurance outpace revenue increases



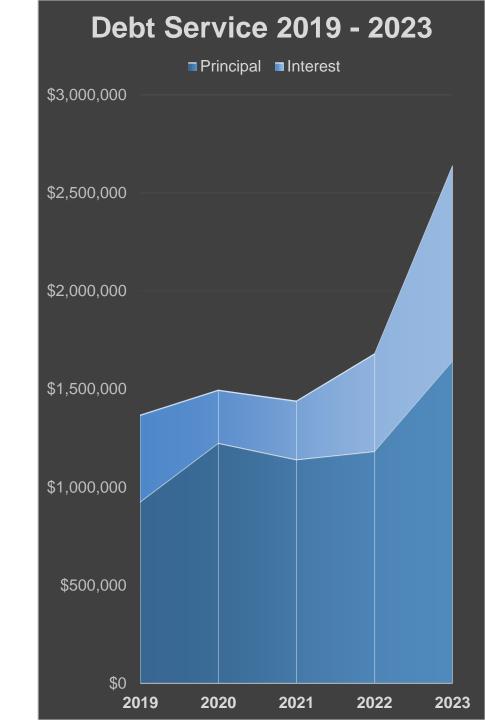
How do we compare to other towns and to Bergen County





Our debt service has almost doubled over the last 5 years to over 2.5 million annually.

Even if we were not to incur any new debt (which is unrealistic), it will stay above \$2 million until 2028.



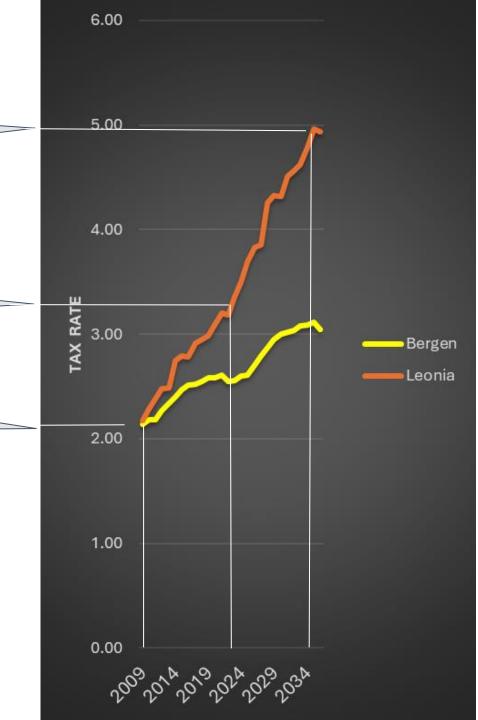


Where Taxes will go if we continue on this path

in 10 years, Taxes on the average home would be over \$21,000 - or more

2022 Taxes on the average home: \$13,957

2009 Taxes on the average home: \$10,382





# The Process to get to 2.98%

Input

- Expense requests came in with 10% increase
- Capital requests came in at over \$3,000,000

Reality Check We recognized that we needed to slow the pace of tax increases

Set Limits

- We limited the expense increase to 3%
- We limited the capital budget to \$750,000

Compromise

 Working with each department, we arrived at the 2024 budget with the stated limits. It requires compromise on everyone's part.

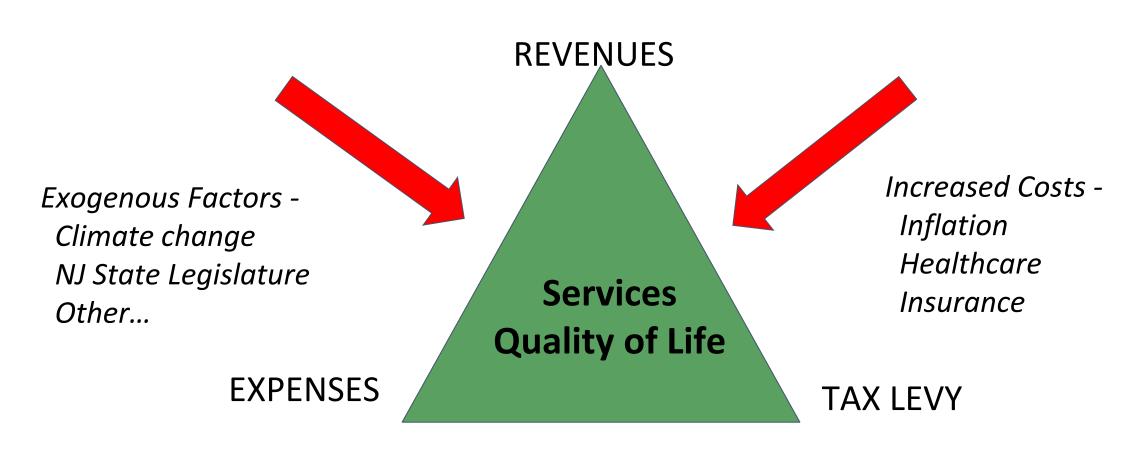

# Pressures to the Balance

### The math is simple: EXPENSES less REVENUES = TAX LEVY





## **Attack Expenses**

**Short-Term:** Intra-Borough Efficiencies. Reduction of Services?

**Medium-Term:** Inter-Borough Agreements, Shared Services. Reduction of Services?

**Long-Term:** Big picture items. Restructuring. Regionalization. Break-down of "Home Rule".





#### **Increase Revenues**

In support of an \$18MM budget, revenues are roughly \$5MM. Of this, \$1MM is outside of State Aid and Surplus.

**Short-Term:** Few Options.

Longer-Term: Look at the future and make choices.
